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## Read

Consider how what God is showing you from this passage applies to or challenges your life.

## Pray

Talk to God about what you learned from Scripture. Express any questions or doubts, and ask God to help you walk in what His word is teaching.

## WHAT IS THIS?

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This is a short reading plan designed to help you read the Bible and pray daily. Our hope is that through this simple practice, you will encounter Jesus Christ through the Scriptures, and grow closer to God.

The Gospel writings were dictated by close disciples of Jesus, who, after observing his life for three years, were commissioned by him to be “witnesses of these things.” (Luke 24:48)

What you are about to embark on is a journey through one of these writings, the Gospel of Luke. It is the longest and most detailed account of Jesus’ life, words, death, and resurrection. Not only is this one of the few trusted accounts of Jesus’ life, but the apostle Paul (another commissioned disciple of Jesus) went on to describe it as “God-inspired” (2 Timothy 3:16).

That means what you are about to read is nothing short of astonishing—it is not like any other book.

At the very least, you will learn about the most fascinating, compelling, and loving person in history. At the very best, you may be completely transformed by him in the process. We are praying that both of these will happen as you go through this Bible reading plan.

You’ll notice that there is a reading guide on the other side. This is to help you get the most out of the Gospel of Luke. The readings themselves are marked and dated on the following page. Simply pick it up on whatever day it currently is and read that selected passage using the guide to help you.
